ASU Universal Learner Courses are a selection of popular first-year college courses available online. Through Universal Learner Courses, high school students can test the college waters and begin making progress towards a college degree, in a low risk financial model.

### ASU Universal Learner Course benefits:

- ❖ Low risk. Pay for your course only if you successfully pass with a “C” or higher.
- ❖ Earn identical academic credit. Same courses, same ASU faculty, same credit. Use the credit at ASU or another university.
- ❖ Begin today. No application required. Start making progress towards your degree immediately.

### How it Works

1. Register and login at [hs.ea.asu.edu](https://hs.ea.asu.edu)
2. Select your courses.
3. Select “Upgrade Course” to take the course for academic credit (\$25 fee).
4. Complete the course with a “C” or better and pay the course cost if you would like to receive academic credit (\$400). If you do not pass the course, no payment is collected.
5. Receive an official transcript with your academic credit, which can be applied towards a degree at ASU or another University.
